

Responsibilities of Managers/Supervisors – Seafarers Industry

As OHS Representatives have the power to issue Provisional Improvement Notices, it is important for managers/supervisors to have a more in-depth knowledge of PINs, why they are issued and how to resolve any breaches of the Act or Regulations.

The knowledge gained during this two days will put managers/supervisors in a better position to demonstrate competence and contribute to the OHS needs of staff in their areas of responsibility.
